

ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTIONS

PLAYERS –The head coaches will nominate the players they think should be eligible for all-stars. These players do not have to be from the team in which they coach. Once the nominations have been submitted to the Parks and Recreation, a scrimmage/skills evaluation will be scheduled for all of the nominated players only. This will be done so that the coach has the proper knowledge to vote on the all-star players. The head coaches only will attend and evaluate the scrimmage/skills evaluation. In the event the head coach can't attend they may designate an assistant coach to attend in their place. Once the scrimmage/skills evaluation is over each coach will select X number of players (see below) and place the names on a ballot. These will be confidential and will not be shared with the other coaches in an effort to help the coach not be pressured into voting for someone they do not feel is all-star worthy. Parks and Recreation will tally the votes and the results will be emailed out no later than 24 hours after the vote. No coach may leave the scrimmage/skills evaluation without turning in the ballot to a Parks and Recreation representative. No change may be made after this has been turned in. The top X number of players will be placed on the team with the coach choosing the final players to fill the team. The kids will then be contacted and invited to represent Parks and Recreation for the all-star team. Any ties will be decided on by the head coach. Please remember this is not about YOUR kid or your kids friends this is about the best players in the league. We want to represent PALS with the best players we have.

Baseball – 10 voted on and the remainder chosen by the coach Basketball – 8 voted on and the remainder chosen by the coach Football – 20 voted on and the remainder chosen by the coach Soccer – 12 voted on and the remainder chosen by the coach Softball – 10 voted on and the remainder chosen by the coach

COACHES – A place on the ballot will be located for the head coach to vote for who they think will be the best head coach to represent Parks and Recreation in the all-star games. The top vote getter will be chosen to coach the team. In the event of a tie, the coaches will be listed on the ballot. Coaches may choose to vote for themselves. This process will allow for the All-Star Staff to be chosen by their peers, without the pressure of a public decision. A coach that is chosen whose child did not make the All-Star team will be contacted to determine if they would still like to be invited as the All-Star Team Coach. Should a coach not be able to fulfill their position, the next highest available vote getter will be invited. Should a tie still exist for head coach or between the top vote getters, the final selection will be determined by Parks and Recreation. The head coach will then chose their assistants.

Parks and Recreation has the right to overturn any votes for the coach and the players if they feel that they are not the best to represent Parks and Recreation.
